Crash Victim's Still 'Serious'

A New Hudson woman sustained serious injuries February 13 when the car she was driving struck a tree after swerving to miss a trash bag in the road.

According to South Lyon police reports Noreen Bane lost control of her car while traveling south on Milford Road near Pontiac Trail. She was taken by South Lyon ambulance to St. Joseph's Mercy Hospital where she remains in serious condition as of press time.

Cicily C. Long of 26965 Milford Road, Apartment 17, reported that someone had attempted to hot wire her car early Friday morning. She stated that the ignition wires had been ripped out and papers had been ignited on the floor of the vehicle, damaging the carpet and the floor mat.

Richard Dawson of 58101 Twelve Mile Road, reported that windows and insulation had been taken from his new home under construction. The theft occurred last week Wednesday.

Merle Farley of Merle Farley Excavating Company reported thieves had broken into his storage garage on 510 Dorothy Street February 23. Stolen items included a pump valued at \$700, hand tools, a saw and a battery charger. Police believe at least two persons were involved in the theft.
