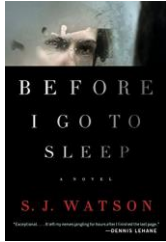
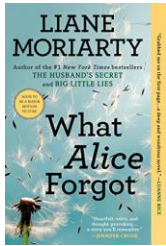


I CAN'T REMEMBER...



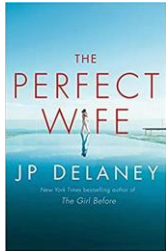
Before I Go to Sleep (S.J. Watson)
