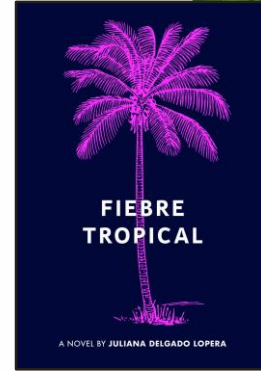
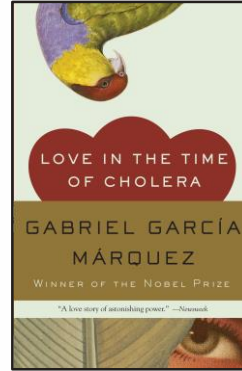
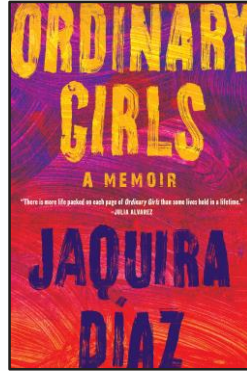
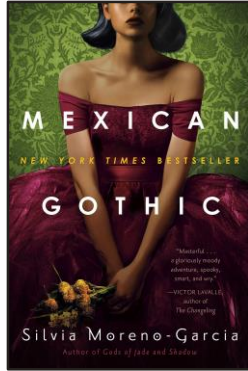
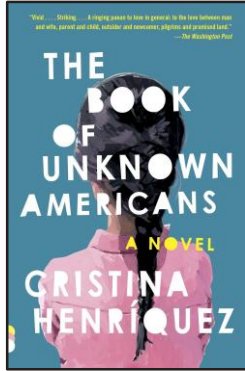


Celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month
